**Sandy Lyle and Jerry Pate  
Granted Exemptions to Compete in  
Home Care & Hospice First Tee Open at Pebble Beach**

Pebble Beach, California – Eight time PGA TOUR winner Jerry Pate and Scotsman Sandy Lyle have both been granted sponsor's exemptions to play in the Home Care & Hospice First Tee Open at Pebble Beach over Labor Day weekend. Pate, winner of the 1976 US Open and 1974 US Amateur, will join fellow Champions Tour pros Fred Couples, Tom Kite, Scott Simpson, and Tom Watson for the three day event on Pebble Beach Golf Links and Del Monte Golf Course. Lyle won the 1988 Masters and 1985 British Open.

The Home Care & Hospice First Tee Open at Pebble Beach, scheduled for the week of August 31 through September 5, showcases The First Tee, an initiative of the World Golf Foundation which provides young people of all backgrounds an opportunity to develop life-enhancing values through golf and character education.

Clint Eastwood will serve as chairman of the event and former President George H. W. Bush and Arnold Palmer are honorary co-chairs. Play will be conducted on both courses Friday and Saturday and on Pebble Beach only on Sunday. All three rounds will be broadcast internationally on the Golf Channel.

The tournament is hosted by Monterey Peninsula Foundation and The First Tee of Monterey County. The Foundation also stages the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am which has generated over \$85 million for charity since 1947.

Collectively, the Champions Tour has the most recognizable and accomplished players in the game with 16 World Golf Hall of Fame members actively competing in its events and numerous other major championship winners among its members. The Champions Tour is a tax-exempt membership organization of professional golfers age 50 and older. Conceived in 1980 as the Senior PGA Tour, it started with just four events and purses totaling \$475,000.

The Champions Tour will conduct 26 official Charles Schwab Cup events in 2010 offering \$51.5 million in official prize money, with the average tournament purse of \$1.98 million. The Champions Tour's primary purpose is to provide significant competitive and earnings opportunities for its members, to protect the integrity of the game; and to help grow the reach of the game in the U.S. and around the world. In addition to providing competitive opportunities for its membership, Champions Tour events generate significant sums of money for charity. The Commissioner of the PGA TOUR is Tim Finchem.
